

## CPCCLDG3001A Licence to Perform Dogging

### PERSONS WHO WOULD BENEFIT FROM THIS COURSE

---

This unit is appropriate for those working in heavy industries and whom are required to operate as a dogger as a part of their job description.

### COURSE DESCRIPTION

---

This course is designed to provide students with the skills and knowledge required to perform slinging techniques, including the selection and inspection of lifting gear and/or the directing of the crane operator in the movement of the load when the load is out of view of the crane/ operator for licensing purposes.

This unit covers the scope of work to demonstrate competency in the application of slinging techniques, selection and inspection of lifting gear and/or the directing of the crane/ operator in the movement of the load.

This unit is based upon the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.

### COURSE PREREQUISITE

---

- Student must be 18 years old if seeking to apply for HRW licence after completing the course
- Student must be able to read and write in English as prescribed by regulation
- The student must have sound written and mathematical skills
- 100 points of valid ID as per the licensing requirements of Part 4.5 of the Model Work Health and Safety (WHS) Regulations to meet Commonwealth, State and Territory HRW licensing requirements

## COURSE OUTLINE

---

- communication techniques in the workplace including whistles, hand signals and use of fixed channel two-way radios
- Calculate rated capacity of lifting equipment
- Ability to interpret rated capacity and working load limit tags
- Hazard identification and control
- Slings techniques
- Selection and inspection of lifting equipment
- Directing crane operators in the moving of loads in a safe manner, using a slewing crane
- Inspection and care of a wide range of lifting equipment to appropriate Australian Standards and/or manufacturer's specifications
- Appropriate mathematical procedures for estimation and measurement of loads
- Basic knowledge of types of cranes and their functions
- WHS legislation, standards and codes of practice relevant to the full range of techniques for undertaking dogging activities
- Load stability and safety factors in line with manufacturer's specifications
- Understanding of the hierarchy of control

## COURSE STRUCTURE & DURATION

---

Full Training & Assessment Course: Formal Training, Theory and Calculations Assessment and Final Practical Assessment. 5 days duration.

Formal Training, Theory and Calculation Assessment and Logbook:

Formal Training is completed.

Written knowledge test and calculation assignment can be completed at the end of the formal training, logbook hours under a ticketed supervisor.

Student can request a practical final assessment when they feel ready. 3 days plus 1 day for final practical assessment.
